#### **Christmas Fair**

We hope you all had a fantastic Christmas and a Happy New Year from Ripley Parish Council. We were delighted to bring the Christmas Fair back onto the High Street – even if it was a rather last-minute change due to adverse conditions on the Green. Almost without exception visitors and stallholders alike told us how much they love the atmosphere of having stalls along the street.

In financial terms, the fair did well too and was pretty close to the £14,500 the Parish Council has to spend on the fair and the lights. At £14,179 there's a relatively small shortfall with that income coming from stall fees, raffle tickets, mulled wine, and generous donations from businesses. A big thank you to Emily Louise Brown and Matt Jelley, singer and compere respectively, volunteers, sponsors, raffle prize donators, individuals who donated via GoFundMe and Cllr Sarah Gill for steering the ship and arranging the entire event. Thank you to everyone.



#### **Finance**

One of the hardest jobs the Parish Council has to do is balance the books. Our main source of income is the Parish Precept, which is part of the Council Tax everyone pays to Guildford every year. We have, in the past, also been able to access grants from Guildford for specific one-off items such as a new Roundabout for the children's playground. You may have read that Guildford Borough are in financial difficulties, and as a result have stopped these grants meaning that we haven't been able to replace the Roundabout (yet!). But it's actually a "double whammy", because they will also start charging us for things that they never used to. From next year, we will have to pay to have the bins on the green emptied, at well over £100 per bin. Sadly, this means that many of the smaller red 'dog litter' bins will be removed, although some will be replaced with large green all-purpose bins. The dog walkers in the village

are doing a fantastic job clearing up after their dogs; please use the green bins in future when the red bins have gone.

It is about this time of year when the council has to prepare a budget for the coming year. It is never easy: on the one hand, we know that many people are financially stretched and can't afford a big increase, but on the other hand the loss of money from Guildford means that we need more than ever before just to keep the status quo. - Cllr lan Baker

#### Wisley Airfield Planning Appeal

Ripley and Send Parish Councils have worked together at the recent Wisley Airfield Planning Inquiry to oppose the development put forward by Taylor Wimpey. The two councils applied for Rule 6 status which allowed us to put forward our objections and cross-examine Taylor Wimpey's experts to challenge their case for allowing the development. The full report on the inquiry can be found in the Send Parish Council section in this edition. - Cllr Richard Ayears

#### **Junction 10 Improvements**

As part of the Development Consent Order for the Junction 10 improvements, Ripley High Street will see a series of speed tables along its length, and it is expected to see a 20mph limit replacing the current 30mph limit. There will also be a new pedestrian crossing near the Village Hall and another road narrowing and priority vehicle movement in Newark Lane outside Hedgecroft Cottages to slow vehicles leaving the village.

The Secretary of State required National Highways to put together this scheme to mitigate the impacts of additional traffic following the creation of the new Wisley Lane diversion on Ripley High Street. The Parish Council, although not a statutory consultee, has worked with National Highways and Surrey Council to develop a scheme which the Secretary of State has recently approved.

National Highways and Surrey County Council are now working up the details of the scheme which is currently planned to be installed during August and September this year.

The Parish Council are continuing to work with Surrey to develop a scheme to reduce the speed along Portsmouth Road as well as Polesden Lane, Newark Lane and Rose Lane. - Cllr Richard Ayears

# **PARISH COUNCIL**

I am pleased to report the public inquiry into the Wisley Airfield planning application, 22/P/01175 has now concluded after it was extended into December.

Send and Ripley Parish Councils participated in the inquiry as a joint Rule 6 party, meaning we had a seat at the table to make a case and challenge the appellant (Taylor Wimpey) on their proposals. After we had been cross-examined in October, in November it was our turn. On behalf of the Ripley/Send team I was able to question, at some length, the appellant's transport witness Mr Mckay on the impact of the proposals on our local road networks; and Mr Collins, Director of Planning at Savills UK, on the site masterplan. In December, the sessions focused on the S106 legal requirement if permission is granted, and planning conditions. We presented our closing statement on the 19th of December - just in time for Christmas!

Aside from the Wisley inquiry, SPC continues to be vigilant and make robust representations on planning applications relating to Send Village. Our Planning and Environment Committee led by Cllr Hurdle, has been putting a lot of diligent work into making representations to several recent windfall applications. These were not allocated sites in the Local Plan and include eight dwellings at Heath Farm in Tannery Lane and the most recent proposals for development of the Send Barns Stables at Woodhill. A member from SPC spoke at the GBC planning committee in early January to represent residents to oppose the application for five dwellings at number 94 Potters Lane. It was also good to hear the views/concerns of residents of Send Hill at our January meeting on GBC's approval of the sale of the Send Hill sandpit.

SPC is fortunate to have a great team of Cllrs who bring a depth of experience and community focus to Council projects. Cllr Goehler continues to drive the Pavilion re-development project and our new Cllrs have been assisting with some very productive engagement events. In December the Council approved moving the Recreation Ground charity to an incorporated structure, ClO to help facilitate the project and bring it up to date with current charity legislation. While we are fortunate that this project will be mainly funded by S106 from the Clockbarn development and Garlicks Arch, the Council had some major expenditures this year to replace the play equipment at Maple Road, a new bus shelter in Send Marsh and other groundworks in our playgrounds, open spaces and at the cemetery. This is reflected in a rise to our Precept requirement for the next financial year.

Finally, a note for your diaries. **The Annual Parish Meeting will be taking place on the 11th of March**, in the Upper Room of Lancaster Hall. This will be our final engagement session for you to give us your feedback on what you would like to see from a new Pavilion on the Send Recreation Ground.

We look forward to seeing you there!

# The Parish Church of St Mary the Virgin, Send

A little insight into the running of St Marys' Church while there is no Priest in charge and the timescales on when we might have a new one.

#### Who is In Charge during the Vacancy?

Following Tony's departure, the formal running of the parish is the legal responsibility of the Area Dean and Churchwardens (the Sequestrators).

#### How does the parish function without a Priest in charge?

Whilst the Area Dean will provide oversight and support, most of the work will be coordinated by the vacancy management team who are accountable to the PCC. This will consist of the churchwardens, administrator, treasurer, and others who share in ministerial and administrative support. It will meet regularly to ensure things continue as normal.

## How is our new Priest in charge chosen? Who decides on or new Priest in Charge?

There are five people who will be on the formal interview panel:
The Patron's rep and Bishop of Dorking
The Archdeacon of Dorking
The Area Dean of Woking
The two Parish Representatives



#### The Bottom Line...

So when can we expect to welcome our new Priest in charge? If we are successful in appointing a new Priest in charge in June, we might expect an induction during September/October. The average time between an appointment and an institution is approximately 4 months.

Next issue we will update you on further developments.

# WHAT HAPPENS WHEN A GUIDE DOG RETIRES?

It seems only yesterday I was saying goodbye to my first Guide dog Justin, but here we are again, this time saying goodbye to Rosie, who formally retired on the 6th of November.

We have come a long way and have become popular with residents, and at the voluntary work I do in the Debra Charity shop in Send. She was liked by



staff and customers. I had Rosie for eight years and she celebrated her 10th birthday on October the 10th. We have overcome many challenges over the years with the two dogs I have had - a 15 year stretch, but sadly, as most of you know in the news over the past a few months, there has been a shortage of puppies and staff at Guide Dogs, and due to Covid the breeding program had to come to a halt. Fortunately now things are on the move and waiting lists are coming down, which brings me to the next thing. Now that Rosie has retired it could be a two year wait for my next dog. Most of you may go into a car and go off to see friends and so on, but my kind of life is slightly different, however. Rosie was my vehicle and therefore she was trained to guide me around obstacles and sadly this includes cars parking on the pavement which is now becoming a constant problem. Nevertheless it was a challenge and these are things that she overcame. We had a steady routine day in day out, and probably some of you have seen me on my travels from Village to Village, and throughout the villages, but sadly all this came to an end on November 6th, retirement day.

The impact of losing a guide dog is very hard on a guide dog owner, although they go to either family or friends, as first port of call. If this is not available and not an option then they can go back to Guide

Dogs for those on a waiting list which is very extensive. Fortunately I have been lucky with the two dogs I have had and they have gone to respectable homes which I had to denominate as there were two up for nomination. This is a hard decision for any guide dog owner. If they have to give up a guide dog the impact is the fact that once the guide dog retires and has to be rehomed it is devastating. Firstly giving up their loved friend which they have bonded over the many years together. This could be eight years or even nine years and to give them up is very hard. This can lead to loneliness anxiety and, in some cases, depression. They are not just a dog. They have been a long service dog that helps people with their mobility. This time for me there could be a long wait - it is very much possible that there will be a two year wait for my next guide dog. It's going to be hard, but I am having some training with my cane, preparing myself ready for this day. Having a cane is very restrictive. Unlike a guide dog who will manoeuvre and guide you around, a cane symbolise visual impairment or even blindness. I have many challenges ahead still to come, but I know with help and support we will get there in the end. It was a sad sad day when she went.

On a positive note I celebrated 25 years at the Debra charity shop, Send, with family and colleagues who have supported me endlessly and that was very special and very emotional. Of course, mentioning Rosie retiring was one of them. I got a lovely card signed by all my colleagues and a special 25 year medal. There was even a special cake made as well as an Amazon voucher. It was a pleasant evening. You can see my article on the Debra website which is www.debra.org.uk. From there, if you click on news and blogs, you will find the 25 year anniversary article with lots of pictures and the story behind it. This was very exciting and made a massive milestone not just for myself but also for Rosie. She was included which was vitally important because I wouldn't be doing the things I am doing today without the help of a quide dog. It has certainly changed my life.

When retiring a guide dog, it can be very sad as you have been a partnership for eight or nine years together. It is like losing a loved one or a relative, that kind of thing. You know each other's movements and routines. What happens when the dog retires is that obviously the

routine completely stops although the dog is still alive. Handing her or him over means missing part of the partnership that has lasted for eight or nine years. When it comes to an end you get a little bit lonely and very sad, sometimes a little bit isolated. Every guide dog owner goes through this for a period of weeks. Although I will be getting a new dog this is going to take some time - possibly a two year wait. During this time, we have got to go back to the old method of using my cane again from scratch, as it has been 15 years since I've last used my cane. A cane can detect your environment and what maybe is in front of you, and what is on the pavement and finding obstacles to a point. However, a guide dog can do so much more, they learn to assist before you even approach the obstacles, so they can determine the best course of action and guide you safely round them, rather than bumping into them. This can be roadworks, wheelie bins and sometimes cars parked on the pavement which is a very big issue. Retiring a guide dog is a very stressful time. There is lots of preparation before the big day of retirement. This is making sure you get things ready like medication and dog beds and getting all their belongings together, before you do the final walk. Finally signing paperwork and handing them back to Guide Dogs or even your nominated family. In Rosie's case there were two nominations. As I live on my own I was unable to keep my dog like some people can so it was very stressful and upsetting, but I know Rosie will be safe with her new family.

I can recall when I was working how convenient it would have been to be able to see a doctor at the weekend so we hope patients find this service beneficial.

#### **RIPLEY VILLAGE HALL UPDATE WINTER 2024**

As I write this in January, I am sure you have all noticed our lovely new building now that the scaffolding has come down! The village hall looks fantastic from the outside, complete with our nod to the Lovelace diamond patterned brick design on the front of the building.

We continue to be delighted with our building contractor Buchanan and Son who are doing a wonderful job managing the complexities of this construction. We remain on time and on budget for completion at the end of April.

We would like to thank The Community Lottery Fund (National Lottery) for our most recent funding grant of £162,000 which has enabled us to complete the project without the requirement for further loans. Trustee Chairman Gill Haig-Brown has worked tirelessly over the past few years to secure funding from many different sources to enable the project to come to fruition.

The new building looks just as good on the inside and we can't wait to show it off to all the residents of the village when we officially open (likely to be early in May 2024 to allow for landscaping and final finishing). We have recently been working closely with some of the members of the Pantomime committee in order to purchase and fit out suitable sound and lighting for productions in the main hall and we hope that they will be encouraged to expand their amateur dramatic output to more than one production per annum!

All 3 halls in the new building will offer huge scope for a large range of activities such as drama, music, crafts, meetings, exercise classes, after-school activities and the like. It will also make a wonderful venue for a wedding or large celebration. There are kitchen facilities to each hall and the whole venue looks incredibly smart and nothing like your normal village hall! Please bear in mind if you have a big event coming up and are looking at suitable venues, Ripley Village Hall offers fantastic value for money with great facilities and it is an ideal location with plenty of parking.

# Lawn/Short Mat Bowls for All

by Norman Ford (Ripley Bowling Club)

"You don't have to be close – just closer" These are the words of Australian Lawn

Bowler lan Schuback many years ago and they are still true today. Lawn & Short Mat Bowls are very similar. Lawn Bowls is played outdoors on grass over a distance of approximately 45 yards (40 metres), whereas short mat bowls is played indoors on carpet over a distance of circa 45 ft (13 metres).



Both have the same concept. A small ball called the jack is set some distance from one end and the team have to get as close as possible to this ball from the other end of the rink with as many of their bowls as possible. The number which are closer than your opponent is the number of shots your team scores (or concedes to the opposition,

if theirs are closer). The rub is that the bowls do not run straight. They are biased one way, so they travel in a curve, which makes the game quite difficult at times.

Teams can comprise up to 4 players per rink and can be over several rinks. For example, Ripley Bowling Club in Rose Lane has 4 outdoor rinks and 2 short mats in the clubhouse. Matches are usually played over 18 ends, though it can vary dependent on the game being played. Both genders can play on equal terms and there is no bar to age.






