### **Junction 10 - National Highways**

In early July I met with Jonathan Wade, the Senior Project Manager at National Highways who oversees the Junction 10 works to review the proposed plans for the traffic mitigation in Ripley High Street prior to them being submitted to Surrey County Council. The plans, designed by National Highways, include a series of speed tables along the length of the High Street, a new raised pedestrian crossing outside the village hall and the introduction of a 20mph zone. All of these new features are being submitted to Surrey for their final approval as the highway's authority for this stretch of road and delivery of the works is now expected in October/November this year. The slight delay from dates published earlier is due to the later opening the Wisley Lane diversion which ran into technical problems during works back at Easter time.

In addition to the scheme for the High Street the Parish Council with the assistance of SCC secured a second pinch point in Newark Lane outside Hedgecroft Cottages to slow vehicles exiting the village towards Pyrford, this should be delivered at the same time as the High Street Works.

### **Former Wisley Airfield**

Following the decision of the Planning Inspector to allow the Taylor Wimpey plans to develop the former airfield site on completion of the public inquiry we will inevitably face more traffic flow through the village as the requirement within the Guildford Local Plan for the Burnt Common Slips to be constructed were unfortunately not included in the Inspectors decision. During the inquiry and the subsequent approval, it has made a provision of the development for Taylor Wimpey to fund

traffic calming and mitigation works in and around Ripley. The Parish Council already has a draft plan that would see speed limits reduced along Rose Lane, Newark Lane, Polesden Lane and Grove Heath as well as the Portsmouth Road which would also see speed tables being constructed.

We will be looking to engage with officers from SCC at the earliest opportunity to work up the details of the scheme and hopefully discourage through traffic entering our local roads and that which does will do so at a reduced speed.

As you maybe aware VAWNT, WAG and Ockham Parish Council are requesting a Judicial Review of the Inspectors decision and although Ripley Parish Council have decided not to partake in the action we do offer our support to those involved. # Send PARISH COUNCIL

### Just when we thought we couldn't get any busier...

At the Annual Council meeting in May, I, Cllr Julia Osborn was elected as Chairman of the Council for a second term and Cllr Hurdle as Vice-Chairman for the 2024-25 year. Cllr Hurdle also continues as Chair of the Planning Committee and Finance Committee. Cllr Bruton was re-appointed as Chair of the Amenities Committee and Cllr Goehler as Chair of the Pavilion Redevelopment Committee. The Council was also pleased to co-opt Mr Hugh Thomas to fill our vacancy.

In June, the collapse of the sewer and closure of the main A247 brought challenges with the diversion of traffic and unsuitable large HGVs through Potters Lane and other rural areas of the Village. The Parish Council was in contact with our Borough and County Cllr and liaised with our MP. They in turn were in communications with Thames Water. The main road was opened ahead of schedule, although the closure seemed like an eternity.

During this period, bins were also removed from the Send Recreation Ground and some other locations in Send due to an excessive increase in costs from our contractor Guildford Borough Council (GBC) for collections. We recognize the concerns that have been expressed but we are also aware that there has been a lot of misinformation on social media. The Council has retained four bins on the Recreation Ground. All bins along the main road, at bus stops in Send Marsh, Burnt Common, and at the Send Shopping Parade. Location maps of these bins can be found on Parish notice boards and our website. We are also grateful to our volunteers, our caretaker, Parish Cllrs, and our residents for taking rubbish home and for keeping the Recreation Ground tidy throughout the Summer.


Before June was out, the decision for 94 Potters Lane was finally published. The Council is aware that over 70 residents had objected to this application and the site's location within the Corridor of the River Wey, is an important part of Send's

character and appearance. As such the Council sought legal advice following GBC's planning committee's decision and was advised of there being grounds to challenge the decision. The Council held an Extraordinary Council Meeting on 1st July to assess the public 'will' for making a challenge. The Council was blown away by the support from residents and donations we received following this meeting. The Council was able to file the claim on 24 July 2024. A second stage of fundraising will be required in Autumn to take the matter to a hearing. Please look out for details online and in our forthcoming newsletter to residents.

Other important planning matters to note include an application to build 10 dwellings on part of the allocated site A43 in the Local Plan at Send Hill. Wisley Action Group has also applied for a Judicial Review to challenge the granting of approval for 1730 dwellings at the former Wisley Airfield, following approval by the inspector in May.

## St Mary Magdalen, Ripley

It has been quite the summer for sport. Euro 2024 and Wimbledon led seamlessly into the Olympics and as I write we still have the Paralympics to look forward to. You may be one of those people who love watching sport – or you may be sick of it already. Most of us will have been drawn into the events at some level – there is something special about cheering on our favourite, our team or our country. Sport can inspire a spirit of competitiveness, but also inspire a spirit of friendship and inclusion. The three Olympian values are excellence, respect and friendship, while the original values of Olympism as expressed in the Olympic Charter were to 'encourage effort,' 'preserve human dignity' and 'develop harmony.'

In the 1992 Olympics in Barcelona the British runner Derek Redmond was favourite to win a medal in the 400m final. Halfway through the semi-final he tore his hamstring and fell to the ground. He struggled to his feet and began to hop on his left foot, determined to finish the race. His father ran from the stands, put his arm around his son and helped him across the line. If you haven't seen the video, it's available on You Tube; it's worth a watch and embodies all the Olympics is about.

In the Book of Hebrews, in the Bible, it tells us to "run with perseverance the race that is set before us." We each have our own trials and tribulations to overcome in the race that is set before us. Perseverance isn't always easy and on occasion we will fall. But just like Derek Redmond we have a Father in God, who is always alongside us. We never have to try and finish the race alone because he is there beside us, waiting to pick us up and accompany us to the finish line.

Summer always seems to exist in its own time zone. Many of our usual activities pause and this can give time for rest, recuperation and refreshment. It can also feel challenging at times and the holidays can be a lonely time for some people. You are always welcome to pop into the church – not just for Sunday Services but for Toddlers on Monday or our coffee morning each Wednesday morning. 

Villages Medical Centre would like to apologise for an earlier article we wrote for the Send and Ripley Matters. It stated that Physicians Associates work in the same way as GP's, which they do not. To help make clear the role of a Physician's Associate and how they complement the surgery team we have asked our PA Olivia to explain a bit more about her training and role at the practice.

Physician Associates have been working in the UK since 2003 and there are around 4,000 Physician Associates working in the NHS in England as of 2023. This role is more common in the US, where there are more than 178,700 Physician Associates working today.

Physician Associates are generalist healthcare professionals who work always under supervision of a doctor to assess, examine and diagnose patients. They are also able to interpret test results, perform tests and procedures such as ECGs and blood tests, design treatment plans and work with patients for ongoing healthcare management.

The Physician Associate course is typically a 2-year intensive post-graduate course, where applicants have first obtained a health sciences related degree and often have prior healthcare working experience. The first year involves intense training in various subjects including musculoskeletal and rheumatology, cardiology, respiratory, endocrinology, gastroenterology, paediatrics, obstetrics and gynaecology, urology, ophthalmology, ENT, neurology, psychiatry, dermatology, strokes and frailty/multi-morbidity. The second year is largely the placement year, where the student attends hospital and GP surgery rotations.

Personally, my first degree was a BSc in Psychology and I then completed a two-year masters in Counselling and worked with patients in NHS and private mental health services for a number of years before deciding to retrain as a Physician Associate. I have worked in a GP surgery for almost 2 years as part of a multi-disciplinary team. The GPs provide invaluable supervision to me based on their extensive medical experience in different specialities. 

Hello I'm Rebecca. I am a 44-yearold mother of two adult children and The Ship's new landlady.

I have always wanted to run my own pub, working front of house as an adult and growing up in and around pubs as an 80's baby. That sense of social and local village buzz is something I've wanted to be a part of.



I first moved into the village before lock down and that's when I fell in love with Ripley village. Being a single female at the time I used to pop into The Ship with my dog and got taken in by the locals and especially Colin the barman, it felt like a safe, happy place, full of history and stories. I then started working part time at The Ship for over three years and my partner (Timothy) joined the team not long after.

The house I rented in Ripley had to be sold, I was so sad to leave the village. It was divine timing that Harry the previous long-standing landlord generously put me forward to take over The Ship. How could I fill these shoes?

It was a hard baton for Harry to pass over to me, with all the wonderful memories him and his late wife Lisa created and to leave their family home of nearly 30 years. I felt very overwhelmed but had a massive amount of support

from the local people to take on this amazing opportunity.

My deep connection to The Ship and the local community feel inspired me to take this new adventure something I had never done before. Tim's family had been in the village for over twenty years, this also meant we could move back into the village. We were ready for the task ahead.



However, the journey wasn't easy. To become a publican, I had to complete a public licence. The deadline to get the licence was nail-biting as I had to apply to the local council and the police after completing the course and this was done the day before we started trading all due to a lot of investigating from myself and finding the right people to speak to.

During this time my partner's father was just starting to undergo cancer treatment which was unexpected, and we were desperate to move into the village to look after and him and our family. Sadly, he suddenly passed away before we could finalize the contract to the pub. His memory inspires us to make The Ship a place where everyone feels at home.

Six months on now and we've been hard at work revitalizing this beloved local pub. There's so much character and history to The Ship. With its unique solid elm tables made by the landlord John Pullen from 1870-1895 it is a feature that still stands strong today. I enjoy all the stories and memories that get shared to me over the bar from returning and local customers. The external decorations are nearly complete, giving the pub a fresh and welcoming look. We've also tackled numerous restorations to address the dilapidations, ensuring that The Ship maintains its historic charm. A small classic pub menu has been introduced with ongoing small changes to ensure that there's something for everyone to enjoy. We have a fantastic monthly quiz, and regular live music. When you step into The Ship you will be in an award-winning pub from Cask marque giving us 5-star rating! Makes all the hard work from all the staff worthwhile. We will continue making improvements to the pub's facilities and ambiance, creating a space where the community can come together and relax.



# SEND GARDENING SOCIETY

At our meeting on 5 June 2024, David Standing spoke about Gilbert White, the naturalist who lived at Selbourne. David was Head Gardener at Gilbert White's house and his enthusiasm for his work and passion about old varieties of plants and the history of the gardens ensured it was a very entertaining evening. David also brought plants for sale.

On Weds 19th June members met for a guided walk by our chairman along local waterways. We met at Ripley Green and walked with views of Newark Priory, on to Walsham Lock and back via the golf club bridge to Ockham Mill before returning to Ripley Green. In addition to looking at native and non-native vegetation growing along the waterway, Derek pointed out the sewage release pipes into the River Wey from the Ripley Treatment Works. Further on, Derek explained that the fish pass channel route upstream alongside Walsham Weir is a mixture of a 170m long naturalised channel with fish-friendly hard structures that reduce the water flow rate so that multiple fish species and eels can make their way upstream. This replicates a natural stream with environmental benefits. A novel brush, fish tile and dividing wall plied outlet section reduces the water velocity. This fish and eel pass forms part of a chain that allows fish and eels to migrate from the River Thames to new feeding and breeding areas – which, in turn, will improve populations of coarse fish species, eel, salmon and sea trout in the River Wey.

Following the successful talk by David Standing on Gilbert White a SGS visit with a tour of the Gardens and House has been arranged for SGS members on Friday 26th July. With 25 acres of garden and parkland, an 18th century landscape garden with a Gilbert White twist. We are looking forward to seeing his quirky and innovative garden techniques and design.

On Wednesday 7th August we shall be meeting in a member's garden for our annual summer picnic. A chance to relax and appreciate the planting and outlook of a fellow gardener's endeavours.

The 2024 programme continues on 2nd October 2024 – Gardening in tune with the moon presented by Isobel Bernhard. This promises to be very interesting and revealing evening. The age-old practice of planting by the Moon's phases has been used by gardeners and farmers for ages.

Our 2024 programme concludes on Wednesday 4th December with the AGM and Christmas social.

Send Gardening Society provides local gardeners with an opportunity to get together and learn more about growing plants of all kinds. We meet up once every 2 months with fellow 'gardeners' for a sociable and interesting evening. We have a varied programme that includes talks from speakers who are experts in their field, garden visits in summer and practical workshops. # DOWN YOUR WEY

With the summer finally arriving down by the river, sporadically at least, there have been changes to the speed of the vegetation growth and changes in how we need to work. On the crazy hot days I prefer an early start and late finish, keeping out of the worst of the sun. It's lovely if you are sitting somewhere breezy with a cool drink but a bit of a slog when you are strimming in long sleeves, dungarees and a visor over your face. Where I can, I still like to use the jungle knife and give the noisy machinery a miss but with so much towpath to fight it's not always practical.

On the bright side, the benefit of the heat if it's dry is the grass on the locksides does slow down slightly. They usually won't last the week but getting a couple of extra days between cuts at some times of the year really helps. Any job that can be put off for a little while frees up time to fit the other things in.

Unfortunately, the warmer days mean warmer water and happier floating pennywort. We have been making an extra special effort this year and the team of volunteers and staff have cleared over many kilometres of riverbank. I wish I could give you that figure in tonnes of plants pulled but I can tell you it is a huge amount. However quickly we get it out, it never feels fast enough. The battle continues.

# **ANNE HAYNES CHARITY**

Late summer sees many of the young people in Send and Ripley taking the next step in their preparation for earning their own living. For some this means apprenticeships, for others it means some further or higher education course. But all of these are eligible for an "Anne Haynes Grant".

This fund has been available since 1702 when Dame Anne Haynes donated a sum to assist children in apprenticeships. The Charity Commission now says of the charity "the interest earned is distributed to young people to help in their further education". A meeting is held annually in the Autumn to administer the available funds which is shared among the young people who qualify and apply for the grant.

The criteria for young people to qualify is that they must live in the Parish of Send or Ripley, they must be under 21 and the money must be used to further their education and prepare them for the workplace.

There are two trustees who have been appointed to administer and distribute available funds from the charity. Rowland Cornell represents Ripley Parish and Arthur Thomas represents Send Parish.
