Remember to note the exact location and any details that might help in identifying the source of the rubbish, especially if you observe the incident happening.

By working together, we can help Guildford Borough Council address these issues swiftly and keep Ripley clean, safe, and beautiful for everyone. Let's keep our village a place we're proud to call home!

M25 Junction 10 Works update

Works have been delayed for the M25 Junction 10 project. A critical component of the project, the S278 Notice, has not yet been submitted to Surrey County Council (SCC). This notice is essential, as it requires SCC's approval of all project-related drawings before work can proceed. The submission timeline for the S278 Notice appears to be considerably delayed, creating a ripple effect on other project elements. In related progress, the Wisley Lane diversion is nearing completion, which will allow National Highways to advance to subsequent stages of the improvement scheme. Despite this progress, concerns have been raised over the stalled request for a 20mph speed limit within Ripley. The introduction of this speed limit remains conditional on the submission of the S278 Notice by National Highways. The Parish Council will continue to monitor the situation and advocate for timely updates to ensure Ripley's infrastructure improvements progress without further delay. Residents are encouraged to stay informed, as these projects impact traffic, road safety, and overall community wellbeing.

Send PARISH COUNCIL

Our Planning & Environment Committee continues to be busy. The Parish Council agreed to an objection to the development proposals for Land to the West of Winds Ridge and Send Hill, part of site A43 in the Guildford Local Plan. Other proposals for strategic sites are also coming forward quickly: a proposal for the next phase of development at Burnt Common Nurseries for 8 commercial units and a reserved matters application for 119 dwellings as part of the Garlick's Arch development. In addition, both development proposals for Land at Heath Drive have gone to appeal on grounds of non-determination by Guildford Borough Council. Send Parish Council's response can be found on our website.

As this edition lands on your mats two legal challenges of planning approvals will be in the process of being heard at the High Court. Send Parish Council on behalf of its residents is challenging the approval of the development at 94 Potters Lane. The Council has taken this step because if allowed to stand this permission opens up the potential for more development along the Corridor of the River Wey. Ockham Parish Council will also be at the High Court in the first week of December to challenge the inspector's decision to approve 1730 dwellings at the former Wisley Airfield.

In September, I attended a meeting of the Potters Lane residents organized by County Cllr Bob Hughes to hear their experiences of traffic issues. Our entire local road network, including the Send Roundabout, is at capacity. I was able to explain to residents the Wisley Airfield development should have provided two new slip roads at Burnt Common, but the inspector accepted the argument put forward by Taylor Wimpey that an 'alternative' package of mitigation was acceptable. This package included carriageway haunching works to Potters Lane, to 'improve cycling'! The Send & Ripley Rule 6 party vehemently opposed the mitigation proposals at the Inquiry last Autumn and insisted the slip roads should have been delivered to alleviate traffic from the rural road network. We will be at the High Court to support Ockham's PC's challenge. On a lighter and jollier note, we enjoyed some wonderful community events this Autumn. Our annual litter pick was combined with bulb planting for young children and a stakeholder session for the re-development of the Pavilion was held at Send EC in October. I, and my fellow ClIrs also had the pleasure of attending the Licensing Service of our new Vicar, Rev. Louise Vincer, and welcoming her and her family to Send. As I sign off this time, I am looking forward to the St Mary's Scout's bonfire, and our Clerk, Nichola


Incomprehensibly made man.



The Lancaster Hall

The Lancaster Hall in Send has long been a Village Hall at the heart of the community. It's a busy hall with lots of regular users but until now the Upper Hall has not been accessible to people with mobility issues.

Many years ago a stairlift was fitted but hardly ever used and eventually became defunct. However, the Lancaster Hall Committee, with the help of Cllr Bob Hughes found out about a grant that could help towards the funding of a new model.

The 'Your Fund Surrey' grant offered by Surrey County Council, allows community groups to apply for funds that can help with community projects, in this case, the funding of a new Stairlift to enable accessibility to the Upper Hall.



Lancaster Hall Chair and Bookings Administrator, Nicole Connell, said: 'This will make a huge difference to the hall. Having accessibility to the Upper Hall and allowing people with mobility issues the option of holding functions/events in this space is something we have wanted to do for a while. We are so pleased with the new Stairlift and on behalf of the Lancaster Hall Committee I would like to thank Cllr Bob Hughes and the 'Your Fund Surrey' grant, for helping us obtain some funding towards this project.'

RIPLEY BONFIRE CELEBRATIONS 2024 *YES, WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES?*



Whilst the organising for this year's event may have started back in 2023, with de-briefs, meetings and discussions regarding money etc., it all started in earnest at the end of September 2024 with our first Sunday cut-back and build.

It was no surprise, that given the appalling weather conditions of 2023, the main topic for discussion was the weather, this continued every Sunday morning during the building of the bonfire, the weather was also heard being discussed in various hostelries in the village throughout the week.

I am pleased to report that despite one Sunday morning when we had a little bit of rain, all our builds, the Friday set-up, the day itself and the Sunday clear up, were all dry, a far cry from the previous year.

So, to the day itself: In anticipation of possible bad weather, some of our crew were on the road at 5.30am, putting out road cones and signage. By mid-morning when we stopped for tea, the topic of conversation was again still the weather, for which the forecast according to the Met Office and BBC Weather was now looking good.

As the day progressed: The sun came out, the funfair started early afternoon, the car parks started to fill with cars, and as the evening closed in, people started to congregate at the village hall to participate in the procession. As a result of the good weather some 175 wax torches were sold, which is believed to be a record.

At shortly after 7pm the procession left the village hall and progressed along the High Street, led as usual by the Surbiton Royal British Legion

Youth Marching Band, followed by the Queen's Carriage and families with children carrying torches. On arrival at the bonfire our Queen for the night. Zelda Wittern and her two attendants. lit the fire to a trumpet fanfare. which due to the dry conditions quickly developed into an amazing inferno, enjoyed by all, as their faces flickered in the light of the flames reaching high into the clear sky night.

This now just leaves the final part of the day's events: At precisely 8pm Dynamic Fireworks shot into the air, treating many thousands of spectators to a wonderful display, the joy on the faces of those looking to the heavens was magical. But the best was still to come, after nearly 20 minutes the whole sky was illuminated with a spectacular finale, which concluded in such loud spontaneous cheers and clapping that you could hardly hear the music coming from the fair.

I would first like to thank all those involved in this year's event: the bonfire builders, the marshals, the collectors, the litter pickers, those that provided transport and equipment, those that











fed and watered an army of volunteers, those individuals and organisations, who gave their services and time over the last month and to our sponsors, without you all, we could not have put on such a successful event.

Finally, the biggest thank you must go to all of you that attended on the night and for your generosity, one of the biggest turnouts for many years with an estimate of up to 10,000 people and some much needed income. So yes, a year does make a difference.

Looking forward to seeing you next year (25th October 2025) for another Legendary Ripley Bonfire.

DOWN YOUR WEY

I seem to always be saying this but it has been a challenging season. The grass and other vegetation has been growing at an astonishing rate, late into the year, but dodging the showers to do something about it has been tricky. I'm perfectly happy getting wet but the grass doesn't like it.

I've continued to step up the floating pennywort fight. It's a question I often get asked, how do we control it? The bottom line is that, on the whole, it's very low-tech and labour intensive. The usual way is just to use a long-handled rake to drag it to the bank where it can be left to rot. You never feel like you are winning. Even if you have taken out enormous rafts there can still be new ones floating down off the backwaters to take its place the next day. We have had a grant from Defra this year to help us that has meant we have been able to acquire new tools and equipment and hire in external resources to help hit it hard. Thankfully I have a couple of fantastic volunteers helping and a couple of group days and so far this year we have cleared over 11 kilometres of bank on the Walsham stretch alone. The fight continues.



ANNE HAYNES CHARITY

Late summer sees many of the young people in Send and Ripley taking the next step in their preparation for earning their own living. For some this means apprenticeships, for others it means some further or higher education course. But all of these are eligible for an "Anne Haynes Grant".

This fund has been available since 1702 when Dame Anne Haynes donated a sum to assist children in apprenticeships. The Charity Commission now says of the charity "the interest earned is distributed to young people to help in their further education". A meeting is held annually in the Autumn to administer the available funds which is shared among the young people who qualify and apply for the grant.

The criteria for young people to qualify is that they must live in the Parish of Send or Ripley, they must be under 21 and the money must be used to further their education and prepare them for the workplace.

There are two trustees who have been appointed to administer and distribute available funds from the charity. Rowland Cornell represents Ripley Parish and Arthur Thomas represents Send Parish.
