National Highways A3/M25 Works Update

Ripley Parish Council continues to monitor closely the progress of the M25 Junction 10/A3 Improvement Scheme, particularly the High Street mitigation measures.

We recently raised concerns with National Highways about delays and a lack of clarity around the delivery of these important works. We highlighted the growing unease among residents that the High Street improvements, required under the Development Consent Order (DCO), might be omitted due to financial pressures.

National Highways has confirmed that the mitigation works will be delivered. While originally intended to proceed via a Section 278 agreement (typically involving developer-funded highway improvements), circumstances beyond the control of Surrey County Council and the project team have necessitated a switch to a Section 8 agreement — an arrangement between two highway authorities. This change has led to some unavoidable delay due to the need for new arrangements and personnel.

However, National Highways has firmly reiterated that the mitigation works are mandatory under the DCO and must be delivered regardless of financial constraints. A full programme of works will be shared with the Parish Council once finalised, and completion is expected during 2025. We will continue to press for regular updates and to ensure all commitments are fulfilled.

Parking in the Village

We have received concerns about misuse of the two-hour bays near the Rose Lane/High Street junction. These bays are intended for short-term visitors to the High Street. If you are staying longer in the village, please make use of the White Hart car park to help ensure spaces remain available for shoppers and visitors.

Ripley Parish Council warmly invites residents to Volunteer's Day on Thursday 26th June, from 6pm at Ripley Cricket Club. This is a fantastic opportunity to meet the many local organisations seeking new volunteers. Shanly Homes Development

Work on the Shanly Homes development at Hamilton Mews (the former White Horse Yard site) will begin shortly. Initial works will include demolition and safe removal of old underground petrol tanks. At peak times, up to 50 workers may be on site, which may affect daytime parking. Shanly Homes is exploring staff parking solutions to minimise impact. A Construction Management Plan will be shared as soon as available, and a Liaison Contact has been appointed to keep Ripley Parish Council and residents informed. Building works are expected to last between 20 and 24 months.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT SEND PARISH COUNCIL ANNUAL PARISH MEETING 2025

I am pleased to present the Annual Report of Send Parish Council for the year 2024-2025.

SEND VILLAGE: A YEAR IN REVIEW

It is fair to say this has been a challenging year. The village is now experiencing the impacts of Guildford Borough Council's (GBC's) adopted 2019 Local Plan, especially the traffic impacts. In June last year the collapse of the sewer and closure of the A247 diverted traffic and unsuitable large HGVs through Potters Lane and other rural areas of the village. The Send roundabout is already operating at capacity in peak times. Following the opening of the Wisley Lane Diversion and the closure of Wisley Lane from the north bound A3 in the Autumn, there was daily congestion along the A247. The village also continues to experience the full impact of the J10/M25 night/weekend closures. This is all before the first occupation of Garlick's Arch and the new settlement at the former Wisley Airfield has begun. Given this context, responses to planning matters consume a lot of time for members of Send Parish Council. I will now turn to this.

PLANNING

When the GBC Local Plan was adopted in 2019, one thing we were assured was that it would be an "infrastructure" first Plan. However, despite the deluge of planning approvals in Send, Send Marsh and Burnt Common, we are not seeing the infrastructure materialise.

The development of the former Wisley Airfield was supposed to have provided two new slip roads at Burnt Common. These were essential to alleviate traffic from the villages that the industrial development at Burnt Common would generate. In December a High Court judge refused Ockham Parish Council a Judicial Review of the inspector's grant of approval of the development at Wisley Airfield. This means the development will go ahead to build 1700 new dwellings but the slip roads at Burnt Common will not be delivered. Meanwhile, an application for the third phase of the industrial development at Burnt Common is soon to be considered by GBC's planning committee, and if approved will take the total industrial floorspace to 14000 sq feet.

A Local Plan is also designed to manage growth while conserving and enhancing other existing features. Unfortunately, the insetting of the villages has led to a constant stream of small backland developments which our planning committee has to constantly respond. It seems that all too often housing supply targets appear to trump all other considerations. One such example is the now 'infamous' 94 Potters Lane proposal for five dwellings in the setting of the Corridor of the River Wey.

SEND'S JUDICIAL REVIEW

Following GBC's approval of 94 Potters Lane, Send Parish Council obtained legal advice and was advised there were grounds for a challenge of the decision. The decision to grant permission for just 'five' dwellings was at odds with previous planning appeals that had REFUSED planning permission for the site. It contradicted the Conservation Area Officer's objection, the National Trust guidance for development in the Godalming and River Wey Navigations Settings, and had failed to take into account the setting of the site within the Corridor of the River Wey and relevant planning policy.

Send Parish Council, with the backing of residents, was not prepared to take this lying down so we took the monumental step of mounting a Judicial Review. Following a hearing at the High Court on the 3rd December 2024, Guildford Borough Council consented to judgement and the permission was quashed. We sincerely hope GBC's Planning Committee will have received the message loud and clear when they re-determine the applications for the site in the near future. Similarly, we hope that the planning committee will also heed the concerns of residents relating to the proposed development for the Land West of Winds Ridge and Send Hill when it comes before the committee. Send Parish Council will be representing residents at these meetings.

PARISH PRECEPT AND PARISH COUNCIL FINANCES

At our first Council meeting every year, in January, the Parish Council approves a budget for the next financial year (currently 2025-2026) and we set the Parish Precept. The Council has undertaken several major projects over the past year including a full programme of work on Parish trees, installing the new play equipment at Maple Road, and ongoing repairs to the Send Recreation Ground. These projects were funded by an increase in the Precept last year. The Council has also led a Judicial Review on behalf of residents but this has been funded nearly in entirety by donations. Further, due to sound financial management, some difficult decisions, and a natural rise in the Precept (with more dwellings in our Parish), we are pleased to report there will be no increase in the Precept for a Band D property this year for Parishioners.

PAVILION RE-DEVELOPMENT

The project is making progress, but this has been slowed this year due to an issue with the release of S106 funding from Guildford Borough Council (GBC). After we escalated the matter to the Head of Planning at GBC, we received the monies owed to us and we can now move forward with converting the existing Recreation Ground charity to a CIO (charity incorporated organisation) and the project's Design Stage. The project will be progressed in phases, the architects are seeking specialist tenders, a meeting with Highways is being arranged to consider parking and a Design Workshop will be held in early April.

AMENITIES AND LEISURE SERVICES COMMITTEE

The Parish Council owns and runs a number of assets in the village, including the allotments, our cemetery, the Send Recreation Ground and the Maple Road play area. The assets require constant maintenance, management, inspections and repairs. I would like to thank Cllr Bruton (Chair of the Amenities and Leisure Services Committee), my Clerk and our village caretaker, Peter Heasmen for their work and daily oversight of these assets. As I have already mentioned the committee has also overseen a large program of works for Parish trees and recently it has been arranging a replacement of the pillar at the cemetery, following accidental damage.

NOTABLE EVENTS

In the Autumn, myself, and fellow Cllrs had the pleasure of welcoming our new Vicar, Louise Mincer, and her family to the village at her licensing service. Send Parish Council was also pleased to be joined by our new MP, Zoe Franklin, and the Mayor of Guildford, Sally Barker, OBE, for our annual Remembrance Day parade.

THE YEAR AHEAD: RE-ORGANISATION OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT IN SURREY

As we look ahead to the next Council year, we now have to consider the proposals the Government has introduced for a major overhaul of local government in England and Wales. As a result of these proposals, Surrey County Council elections which were due to take place in May this year, have been put on hold while a new settlement for local government in Surrey is drawn up. The new settlement will see Guildford Borough Council and other district councils abolished and Surrey County Council become a single unitary authority. This change will mean that some of the functions of the district council, such as planning, will move up to the unitary authority, while other functions relating to some of the services provisions will be "devolved" to parish/ town councils.

MESSAGE OF THANKS FROM THE CHAIR

To conclude I wish to say a few words to express my gratitude. In May it will be a decade since I joined Send Parish Council in 2015. It has been an honor and a pleasure to have served as its Chair for the past two years. As Chair, you bear the ultimate responsibility, and leading a Judicial Review on behalf of the village has been a heavy challenge for me. During this time, my Clerk and myself have faced vexatious communications, and other unrelated hostile actions directed at my family. I am immensely grateful for the support of my colleagues, from Parishioners that I have received, and from long-standing friends in the village, to support my family.

I wish to thank my colleagues for all the time they give as volunteers to serve our village. The Council may not always manage to address every issue as quickly as we hope or wish, but we try. The village is very fortunate to have such a good team of committed individuals who give many hours to bring their expertise to projects while balancing their work and home life commitments. I would also like to say a special thank you to Send residents Claire Nyland, David Williams, Peter Heath, Bruce Gomme and Mr Shatwell (aka 'Bob the Badger Man') for your support and assistance to Send Parish Council with the Judicial Review and help with the deliveries and distributions of leaflets.

Finally, thank you to all Parishioners who have supported us. The excellent attendance at our meetings, especially those related to the Judicial Review and other planning matters, no doubt reflects your concerns. We will continue to work hard throughout the coming year to ensure your voice is heard as we represent you.

Sunday Evenings @ 18:30 – an informal gathering in the Back Hall for Bible study and prayer


Little Lambs – A welcoming group for babies, toddlers, pre-schoolers and their carers on Thursday mornings @ 10:00 in term time.



Geoff ran through an extensive list of shrubs and climbers many of which were unusual and not familiar to all members. This was the venue for a wide selection of bargain plants (both flowers and vegetables) raised and donated by our members. It was great to meet many of the villagers there who came and said hello.

DOWN YOUR WEY

The late spring sunshine and warmth brought a welcome change. Most years trying to find a weather window to get the lock sides painted for Easter feels like an impossible task. Many a year I have been painting by torchlight or in thermals and a woolly hat. This year I got to make the deadline with ease. Lock sides, balance beams, gate tops and bollards all underwent a good rubbing down and

repainting along with one or two bridges so far. Winter offside cutback and the removal of the vestiges or early growth of ever persistent pennywort has absorbed considerable time and effort with the able assistance of volunteers through winter and spring and this will continue throughout the year alongside a multitude of other tasks. Grass cutting is well under way with lock side and mooring cuts ahead of last year, which was itself a good cutting year. We have had gorgeous weather so far this spring and long may it continue with the occasional refreshing dousing of spring rain.

The flitting here and there of early damsel flies, the excited morning chorus of grey wagtails and blackbirds, even the lilting calls of skylarks in nearby fields. The misty mornings and rising ground temperature are the perfect recipe for the bursts of colour and growth all around us. Trees springing back to life with tiny green leaves, colourful buds and blossom, catkins like tiny brushes festooned about, river edge plants flourishing their roots absorbing

the slowly warming water with lock side grasses stretching for the sky. It's a spectacular time of year, perfect for early morning walks, river bank picnics or for watching and listening to the plethora of wildlife we are blessed with here. Apologies if my mowing and strimming damages your calm.

At the far end of the graveyard of St Mary's Church, you will find a hidden gem called Chapel Nature Reserve. These days you will find a wildlife pond brimming with plants, aquatic life, insects, birds and animals, but it wasn't always like that. Back in 2015 it was a disused boggy bit of land covered in brambles, which flooded regularly into the gardens of the houses backing onto the land. The idea was formed by Jim Morris, the previous parish clerk and Chris Heath, a local landscape gardener and wildlife enthusiast, to create a natural sanctuary and primarily prevent flooding. Overseen by a dedicated committee group, Chris designed and project managed the scheme offset by a local development. A dew pond was carved out of the clay mud and a boardwalk was installed leading to an oak bird hide/outdoor education space. The empty pond soon filled with the rain runoff from the adjacent farmland and the gardens nearby drastically reduced its flooding.


The frogs and newts soon hopped into the pond followed by the moorhen and her chicks. The stickleback fish appeared, which led to the kingfisher taking up a perch on the boardwalk. A heron could often be seen stalking the shallow bank, then many other pawprints appeared in the mud obviously finding their way to drink from the pond.

A group of volunteers started to meet once a month and with great enthusiasm began planting out hedgerow whips along the borders. Our tasks have included cutting brambles, donning waders to clear pond weed, planting, pleaching, scattering seeds, scything, pruning, thinning willow, installing bird boxes, bat boxes, bug hotels and natural bee hives. We've even been learning the ancient craft of Hedge-laying from the esteemed academy of YouTube.

To carry out tasks alongside each other has felt very harmonious and restorative to the soul. We may not be able to control what is happening in the rest of the world but we can look after our corner of it.



ANNE HAYNES CHARITY

Late summer sees many of the young people in Send and Ripley taking the next step in their preparation for earning their own living. For some this means apprenticeships, for others it means some further or higher education course. But all of these are eligible for an "Anne Haynes Grant".

This fund has been available since 1702 when Dame Anne Haynes donated a sum to assist children in apprenticeships. The Charity Commission now says of the charity "the interest earned is distributed to young people to help in their further education". A meeting is held annually in the Autumn to administer the available funds which is shared among the young people who qualify and apply for the grant.

The criteria for young people to qualify is that they must live in the Parish of Send or Ripley, they must be under 21 and the money must be used to further their education and prepare them for the workplace.

There are two trustees who have been appointed to administer and distribute available funds from the charity. Rowland Cornell represents Ripley Parish and Arthur Thomas represents Send Parish.
