Hello Dear Reader,


Welcome to another edition of Ripley & Send Matters!

#### Margaret Field's Services to the Village

Following Margaret Field's passing earlier this year, Ripley Parish Council offers its sincere condolences to her family and friends and expresses gratitude for the countless ways she enriched village life.



Throughout her life, she devoted her time and energy to an array of local events and causes. A familiar face at the Ripley Christmas Fair and Ripley Farmers' Market, she also served on numerous village committees and gave invaluable assistance to Ripley Bowls Club. Whatever the task, Margaret was always willing to lend a hand and support her neighbours

Margaret was always a supporter of the Council, a voice to be heard and a champion of community spirit.

She will be deeply missed but her legacy lives on in the community she served so faithfully.

#### Playground Rejuvenation

Ripley Parish Council recognises that the existing playground facilities require renewal to better meet the needs of local children and young people. We have a small amount in our annual budget for maintenance and upkeep and the Council is hoping to receive a share of the community funding from the new Shanley Homes development in Ripley (S106 funding) to support a phased programme of upgrades.

Once we have a clearer idea of timeframes we will start to plan how to deliver a more inclusive and engaging play environment, consistent with the evolving needs of the community.

Once funding has been secured, the Council will aim to involve the local community, children and young people, to ensure their voices are central to the next stage of design.

Further updates will be provided in due course.

#### Guileshill Brook: phased restoration to boost flood resilience and biodiversity

A volunteer-led project will begin this year to restore Guileshill Brook. Phase 1 of the brook restoration will remove accumulated woody debris and then reinstate selected logs as flow-deflectors. Wooden stakes will also be installed to stabilise vulnerable banks and create in-stream habitat niches, thereby improving channel morphology and biodiversity. Works must avoid the main spawning and nesting season (October–May) so some works will take place August – Sep 2025 before resuming June – Sep 2026. Balfour Beatty is reviewing whether further protected-species surveys are required; results are expected shortly.

#### **Vandalism**

Ripley Parish Council is saddened to report that the Chapel Nature Reserve has recently been subject to repeated acts of vandalism.

New bins, installed to prevent damage from open flames, have already been deliberately kicked in and partially destroyed. In addition, significant graffiti has been daubed across the wooden seating areas and internal walls of the shelter. These incidents undermine the hard work of volunteers and contractors who have contributed to maintaining this valued green space for the benefit of the community and local biodiversity.

We respectfully remind all parishioners that the Chapel Nature Reserve is a designated local nature site and should be treated with care and respect.

Councillors are investigating how Ripley Parish Council can improve their public loos. Please email any constructive feedback by 31 August 2025 so we can have your views ready for the full council meeting on 17 Sep 2025.

#### Reminder: Motorised Bikes and Scooters Not Permitted on the Green

Residents are kindly reminded that electric bikes, electric scooters, and motorised off-road bikes are not permitted on Ripley Green. Their use is a breach of the byelaws that protect this important village space. This is to ensure we are keeping all members of our community safe.

# Send PARISH COUNCIL

#### **ANNUAL COUNCIL MEETING 2025**

At our Annual Council Meeting in May, Cllr Hugh Thomas was appointed Chair of our Planning & Environment Committee, and Cllr Andrew Roberton took on the Chair of the Finance & General Purposes Committee. Both positions have, for the past two years, been diligently filled by Cllr Debbie Hurdle, who will remain as Vice-Chair of the Council. Cllr Julia Osborn will continue as Chair of the Council. All other Committees remain the same. The Council was also pleased to co-opt Mrs Karen Lord to join the Council.

#### **PLANNING**

Send PC has represented the village at several Guildford Borough Council (GBC) Planning Committee meetings this year.

In March, GBC re-determined **94 Potters Lane** after the original grant of planning permission had been quashed by Order of the High Court in January. Astonishingly, GBC published a decision 'to approve' application 22/P/01966 - ahead of the planning committee meeting. As such, GBC had to refer the application to the High Court to be quashed for a second time! However, the planning committee went on to determine and approve the second and related application 24/P/01457 at the same meeting. The decision dated 2nd July, was only published on 17th July. At the time of writing, legal advice is being sought.

The Parish Council also represented residents to oppose another 'backland' development at **94-97 SEND ROAD**. Application, 24/P/01428, proposed four dwellings in the back garden of the host properties. GBC's planning committee voted almost unanimously to reject the proposals, overturning the officer's recommendation to approve the application on the grounds that the application was not in keeping with the existing character of the area, would be overbearing, and would impact existing residential amenity.

There was also welcome news when the development proposals for Land at Heath Drive were refused on appeal.

It is heartening that we are seeing some success in opposing backland development in the Parish.

#### PAVILION REDEVELOPMENT AND PARISH AMENITIES

The Pavilion Redevelopment Committee showcased building designs at the Mayfair, and there has been a flurry of activity by the Committee over the Summer season, including appointing specialists in preparation for making a planning application, undertaking risk assessments, and establishing a Pavilion & Highways Working Group to examine parking in association with emerging plans for the Pavilion.

The Amenities Committee has been busy with the ROSPA report (Annual inspection of our playgrounds), surveys of the Parish trees, and preparing a bid for S106 monies to go towards new fencing at the Send Recreation Ground. A further section of drainage work has also been completed in the cemetery.

#### **VILLAGE EVENTS & ACTIVITIES**

#### SEND SCOUTS

The Scouts did us proud as ever with the annual Mayfair, this year with a VE Day theme - and an impressive classic car display! In June, I attended the opening of the Scouts' newly refurbished changing facilities. Mr Mark Silcock was also presented with his Mayor's Award for his long service and commitment as Scoutmaster.

#### PUBLIC MEETING ON PLANNING MATTERS

Ms Claire Nyland must be commended for her organisation of a very well-attended public meeting in May, where residents had the opportunity to raise comments and concerns directly with the lead members of Guildford Borough Council regarding planning in our village.

#### **DATES FOR THE DIARY**

We have our Annual Litter Pick on **27th September**. Last year, bulbs were also planted by volunteers. These provided a wonderful display of colour in the Spring this year. We hope to see you there!

And so I think it is with you. your ideas mature gradually - let them grow, let them shape themselves, without undue haste. Don't try to force them on, as though you could be today what time (that is to say, grace and circumstances acting on your own good will) will make of you tomorrow. Only God could say what this new spirit gradually forming within you will be. Give Our Lord the benefit of believing that his hand is leading you, and accept the anxiety of feeling yourself in suspense and incomplete.

**Little Lambs** – A welcoming group for babies, toddlers, pre-schoolers and their carers on **Thursday mornings (a) 10:00** in term time.



Time has marched relentlessly onwards since the Spring 2025 issue of this magazine and our request for new trustees saw us welcome Nick Grewal back in February. Nick is a relative newcomer to Ripley, and it is gratifying to note his instant desire to become involved in village life - we all wish him well.

Following the AGM on 14th July we welcomed 2 more trustees. Nigel Bruder and Peter Hookins and said farewell to Vernon Wood. Nigel has lived in Ripley for a good number of years now, is involved in a number of village activities and is becoming enthusiastically involved with the day-to-day maintenance of the hall. Peter has lived in Send Marsh all his life and will be known to many of you for his past involvement with the Scouts and for organising Ripley Rocks. He replaces Vernon as the bonfire association's representative.

Vernon came to Ripley during World War 2 as a 4-year-old evacuee and has been a familiar face in the village ever since. He joined the Cubs aged 7, followed by the Scouts, and soon found himself involved in scout fund raising concert parties. In 1955 aged 15, he became involved with the newly formed village bonfire association, the scout leader in 1958 and married local girl Mary Stocker in 1962. He was co-opted to the parish council around 1980 following the death of Stu' Paice. Vernon then became involved as a trustee with the old village hall, followed by our new hall. In between he has been involved with most issues of importance in the village, not least the conversion of the old village fire station into the new scout headquarters. Vernon's continuous contribution to the village over the years is unprecedented and we all wish him well for the future.



Following up on observations regarding the somewhat harsh sound qualities within the Garden Hall, we are delighted to announce that acoustic treatments applied to the walls have dramatically improved the situation and this is no longer considered to be an issue. We intend in due course to apply similar treatments to the other rooms. The attendance figures for our music evenings continue to rise, justifying the huge amount of work our Chair, Julie Brown has put into advertising these events both verbally, and from the printing and distribution of posters. 





#### The Victorian Age in Send and Ripley





#### RIPLEY BOY WINS ROUND THE ISLAND RACE Victory for HYPER in Round the Island Race 2025

HYPER, a high-performance catamaran helmed by 75-year-old skipper Harvey Bowden from Plaidy, Looe, Cornwall, claimed an outstanding victory in the 2025 Round the Island Race, winning her class and finishing as the fastest catamaran/multihull on corrected time.

Sailing double-handed, Harvey was joined by 35-year-old crew member Joe Ayears, from Ripley — an inexperienced sailor with just two months of sailing under his belt and no prior crewing experience. The duo's performance was nothing short of remarkable, blending Harvey's seasoned skill with Joe's enthusiasm and rapid learning under pressure.

This year's race drew over 1,000 boats, making it one of the largest yacht races in the world. In the week leading up to the event, unsettled weather raised doubts about whether the multihull class would even be allowed to race. In the end, the green light was given — but competitors faced strong winds and challenging sea conditions around the 50-nautical-mile course circumnavigating the Isle of Wight.

In a fleet packed with experienced teams and top-performing yachts — many of them racing with professional or full-time crew — HYPER stood out not just for her speed, but for her spirit, determination, and the unique story of two sailors from opposite ends of the experience spectrum coming together to achieve something exceptional. (Fun fact: Joe carried a twig from Arthur's stumps with him for good luck!)

Congratulations to HYPER, Harvey Bowden, and Joe Ayears on this truly prestigious and inspirational achievement.

## SEND GARDENING SOCIETY

Whilst the weather this year was an improvement on the 2024 May Day Bank Holiday; there was still wind and rain in the afternoon, so thank you to everyone who braved the weather and came and supported our stall of plants grown by our members.

#### On Wednesday 4th June, Paul Whittle spoke about National Trust Gardens.

Paul gave a very interesting and engaging talk on over twenty magnificent historic buildings throughout the United Kingdom and the beautiful gardens and estates that surrounds them. His wide-ranging and colourful slides of personal visits highlighted glorious flower borders, walled kitchen gardens, gardens, rock gardens, and a turf amphitheatre. He suggested the best seasonal gardens for snowdrops, spring bulbs, azaleas and rhododendrons, wisteria and rambling roses, brilliant autumn colours, winter gardens and of course some with all-year-round interest. Most members mentally added a few ideas to their 'places we must visit' list.

On Wednesday 9th July a group of members met at Ripley Common and walked along the Wey navigation Canal to the Anchor pub in Pyrford. Led by our Chairman Derek, he pointed out various plants of interest both on the water and banks of the canal. Refreshments were taken at the pub before returning to the common via Ockham Mill and local footpaths – and the sun shone!

Visit to Ham House on Tuesday 22nd July a group of members met at NT Ham House for a garden tour. We learnt about many of the features, why the topiary is shaped as it is, that the walled kitchen garden has been used to grow fruit and vegetables for over 400 years and is now planted with heritage crops and fragrant flowers. The cherry garden is filled with 2 varieties of lavender to extend the flowering season for visitors. The parterre has 8 plain grass lawns, which in the 17th century was a way to show off your wealth before the invention of lawn mowers. The wilderness is set out in 16 compartments complete with summer houses and restful areas - from an aerial view this is designed along the lines of the union flag.

At the time of writing, we have not yet held our **Annual August Garden Party** in one of our members' garden—a chance to socialis e and enjoy the outdoor space of a fellow gardener and also find the winner of this year's 'Potato Competition'.

## **DOWN YOUR WEY**

We Brits are very good about talking about the weather and never seem to be happy with our lot. It's always too cold, too dry, too warm or too wet. That said, as much as I appreciate the warm, dry spells, lots of things by the river do struggle, plants, wildlife, dogs and people. Everything becomes parched but I am always amazed how the yellow grass springs back to life so quickly after a dry spell.

I have had lots of early starts and late finishes to avoid the heaviest parts of the job in the warmest parts of the day. The hotter, drier weather does slow down growth to some extent, so I have been able to allow slightly longer in between cuts of the towpath, moorings and locksides but that saved time has been taken up for with dealing with trees. The prolonged dry weather while trees are in full leaf and growing heavier with fruit and nuts can lead to sudden limb drop or stem failure. We have definitely had more of that this summer than us usual. They usually wait for Friday afternoons or Sunday mornings but that seems to be the case whatever the weather. Hopefully the regular visitors to Walsham will have noticed that the Floating Pennywort situation is greatly improved this year. I can assure you that is not a natural phenomenon. An autumn, winter, spring and summer of relentless work by my volunteers and me have seen huge volumes of the invasive weed removed. A targeted, coordinated treatment regime with our colleagues at the Environment Agency has seen early regrowth and new infestations from upstream reduced.

On the positive side, the sleep-deprived nights of weir keeping have been thinner on the ground but water levels are suffering as a result. At Walsham I had more summer boards in earlier than ever before. You may have noticed them between the concrete pillars on the weir bridge. They help me hold on to water in the Navigation, reducing the flow over the tumble bays. I have been able to keep the levels in the Navigation within the required tolerances but unfortunately by holding on to the water, the levels in the natural river lower over time before being recharged by the showers.

With the only predictable thing about our weather expected to be its unpredictability in the future, we are probably going to have to get used to it. We at the Trust are constantly looking at what this might mean for the river, its visitors and wildlife and how we can put mitigation measures in place. At least we'll all still have plenty to talk about.

## **ANNE HAYNES CHARITY**

Late summer sees many of the young people in Send and Ripley taking the next step in their preparation for earning their own living. For some this means apprenticeships, for others it means some further or higher education course. But all of these are eligible for an "Anne Haynes Grant".

This fund has been available since 1702 when Dame Anne Haynes donated a sum to assist children in apprenticeships. The Charity Commission now says of the charity "the interest earned is distributed to young people to help in their further education". A meeting is held annually in the Autumn to administer the available funds which is shared among the young people who qualify and apply for the grant.

The criteria for young people to qualify is that they must live in the Parish of Send or Ripley, they must be under 21 and the money must be used to further their education and prepare them for the workplace.

There are two trustees who have been appointed to administer and distribute available funds from the charity. Rowland Cornell represents Ripley Parish and Arthur Thomas represents Send Parish.
